SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

Today we will return to a more traditional method of receiving communion. When prompted by the Liturgist, kindly form a single line on the right-hand side of the center aisle facing the altar. As the congregation stands and moves forward, we will sing the three verses of Let Us Break Bread Together. The communion servers will provide you with a piece of bread, with the words "The body of Christ given (or broken) for you" followed by juice in a disposable cup with the words "The blood of Christ shed for you." Once you have received the elements, kindly return to your pew. Should you feel more comfortable receiving communion via the individual vials, please advise the servers and they will provide one to you. For those with mobility issues, once the line is finished, Pastor Doug or the Liturgist will say: "If there are any who have not received communion and wish to do so, please raise your hand" and the servers will come to serve you at your seat in the sanctuary, in the narthex, or at the organ/piano.
